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How many older people facing homelessness?

- European Typology of Homelessness and Housing Exclusion (ETHOS)
- Lack of age breakdown in data
- Lack of data
- What age? (65+ 60+ 55+)
 - Significantly more 55+ than 65+
- Conservative/minimum estimates

2. People in emergency accommodation	Unknown [total 132 people of all ages in Temporary Emergency Accommodation]	DHLGH Monthly Homeless Report July 2023
3. People in homeless accommodation	181 people 65+ in homeless accommodation (July 2023), 5-19 per region and 101 in Dublin [plus 2,441 people aged 45-64]	DHLGH Monthly Homeless Report July 2023
4. People in Women's Shelter	Unknown [total 181 places for women and children]	[Oireachtas PQ]
5. People in accommodation for immigrants	1,000+ Ukrainians aged 65+; <100 asylum seekers/refugees; potentially hundreds abroad seeking family reunification	Figures on Ukrainians supplied to Age Action by DCEDIY
6. People due to be released from institutions	Unknown numbers for release in 2023 [119 men 65+ in prison; 361 prisoners 50-64; 6,432 waiting for homecare]	Irish Prison Service (May 2021), Oireachtas (March 2023)
7. People receiving longer-term support (due to homelessness)	Unknown [Tenancies with homeless providers; >22,488 homeless HAP tenancies]	[Oireachtas PQ April 2023]
8. People living in insecure accommodation	Unknown [10,870 older people living 'rent free']	[Census 2022]
9. People living under threat of eviction	Unknown (but significant risk) [18,071 private renters aged 60-69 and 10,038 aged 70+]	[Census 2022]
10. People living under threat of violence	Unknown [1,348 reported cases of physical or sexual abuse in 2022, aged 65+]	[HSE adult safeguarding report]
11. People living in temporary/ non-conventional structures	Unknown [4,424 'temporary households' in 2022; 2,349 Irish Travellers 60+]	[Census 2022]
12. People living in unfit housing	Depends on threshold for 'unfit' [48% BER E, F, G; 25% rural; 13% damp, mould; est.10% accessibility issues; <2% no central heating <0.2% no piped water]	[Age Action, SILC 2020, CSO]
13. People living in extreme over-crowding	Unknown [95,013 households with more people than rooms]	[Census 2016]

Drivers of Homelessness and Housing Exclusion among Older Persons

- > Ageing population (including ageing homeless population)
- > Divorce, separation, domestic violence
- People exiting prison, hospitals
- More older renters
- ➤ Older Travellers
- Older asylum seekers/refugees
- Unfit or precarious housing (renters and home owners)
- Lack of appropriate housing for people with disabilities (lack of home care, inappropriate use of nursing homes, people stuck in hospitals)
- Multi-generational households
